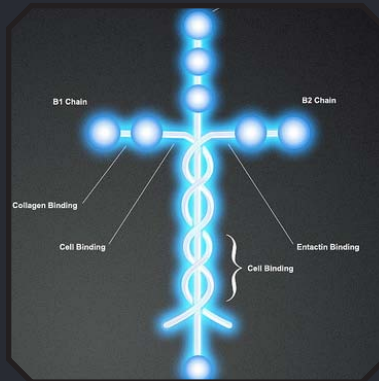
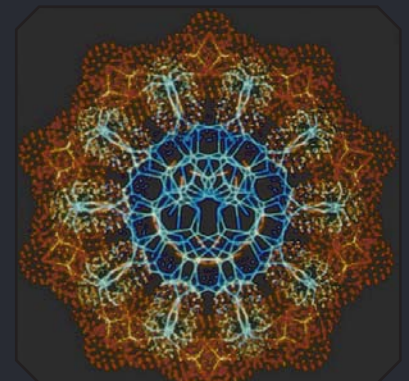


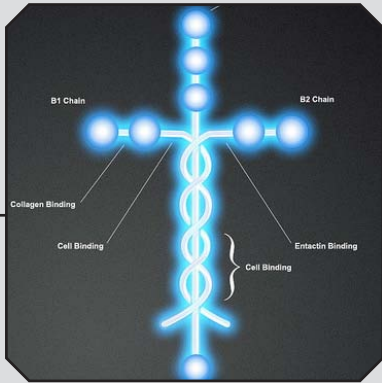

Economic down turn has posed budgetary issues we have had to address, while carrying forward the mission of high quality Christian education. This year we have worked carefully to improve budget processes, to improve specific content in our curriculum, to increase the depth of academic services we provide and to maintain our facility.

As we continue to pursue excellence in all areas of HCS, we praise God from whom all blessings flow. From our dedicated teachers and staff, who are committed to guiding children through a well-rounded Christ-centered education, to the many people, who year after year invest their time, talents and charitable gifts with us, God's blessings abound.



CSI Reaccreditation Process

A site visit is projected for spring 2012. We have already begun the self-evaluation process which requires an in-depth analysis of operations, educational methods, curriculum content, and governance practices. These analytical tasks are carried out by committees composed of faculty, staff, board and constituent representatives. In addition, committees are currently reviewing and updating employee handbooks and policy manuals.

Sonshine Enrichment Center

SEC Preschool continues to grow by leaps and bounds! We are thankful for another year with over 100 children enrolled in our preschool program. Based on our rate of growth over the past three years and increasing interest in a 5-day program, we made plans to expand our preschool program offerings in 2011-12. The preparation process involved curriculum and classroom modifications, as well as the hiring of additional staff.

Technology Upgrades

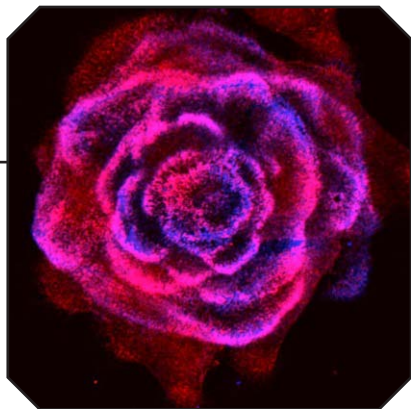
HCS technology has undergone many progressive changes throughout the year, including the on-going implementation of academic data through Edline. In addition, the summer months brought a new server implementation, new technology lab computers, additional classroom computers, updated library software and many other upgrade details that go along with technology implementations. Achieve Program

HCS has been part of a task force led by Elim Christian Services. The task force includes principals, board members and special education professionals. The task force is busy discussing ways to address the needs of children whose academic challenges are not currently being met within the local Christian school. The Achieve Program is being piloted in a skeletal form at Highland Christian School with three students. These students have an Achieve Individualized Education Plan; receive targeted academic support; may have modifications and/or accommodations to general classroom work; enjoy the services of an Elim special education consultant; and are a vibrant part of our community! Continue to pray for the Lord's blessing on this program as it develops.

Fine Arts

Our Fine Arts Festival increased the visibility of students' art work through a videograph of student work shown during student concerts and a physical art gallery in our halls that showcased favorite pieces from the year. Our Music Department added a Chamber Choir for students in grades 3-5. The Chamber Choir performed for four local church services this year. These additions to our Fine Arts program have been well enjoyed by students and parents alike.

International Student Program

Over the past four years, Highland Christian School has hosted several students from Korea. These students, whose families reside in Korea, have relatives who live locally. Knowing their extended family's desire that their children learn in a Christian School environment and gain a cross cultural experience, these relatives contacted HCS and arranged for enrollment. However, due to immigration laws, these students were only permitted to attend for a partial year.



In 2010, Highland Christian School initiated the process of gaining I-17 Certification from the Department of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. We praise the Lord for opening this door at HCS! Following an extensive process, HCS was approved and granted 1-17 certification. Our first full year student under this certification is, Jiye Park. She is enrolled for 2011-2012 in the 8th grade and is a niece of Rev. & Mrs. Oh, ministering at Beacon Light Community Church.

Donna Terpstra rejoined the SEC staff as director & teacher. Donna originally started our preschool program 15 years ago. We are thankful to have both positions filled with much experience and extend a warm 'welcome back' to each of them.

Athletics

An Athletic Booster Club is being organized for the purpose of raising monies for athletic related expenses. A 'Husky Hustle' run is slated for fall, 2012.

Transportation

With 150 bus riders, our transportation team is in high demand! We are grateful to have the resources, skilled drivers (who, by the way, continue Christian education on the road!) and gifted "mechanics" who maintain our bus fleet. Safe and efficient transportation services require labor that is often unseen. We are committed to meeting the needs of our families and appreciate each person who has given to keep these services available. We are thankful for God's provident protection over our six bus routes this year.



Some summer fun and a first place win was in the air for Highland Christian! Our entry in the Illiana Speedway Crash Fest was a smashing success! In the spring, our Art Department sponsored a student contest for "Best Bus Design." James Zandstra, 7th grade, was the proud winner! Faculty, alumni and current students helped paint our oldest bus "Husky Blue." We appreciate the many volunteers and sponsors who helped us raise over \$6000 towards a new bus. 2010-2011 Building & Grounds Highlights

Structure & Grounds

The summer of 2011 kept us busy with many projects. Van Drunen Roofing did a complete tear off and redo of the roof over the west elementary hall. Major parking lot improvements were completed by Site Services. The east parking lot and the playground basketball court were crack-sealed, seal-coated and striped. We completed the basketball court project with fresh paint and new nets. Bill Fulton provided us with a new, larger sidewalk by the west doors leading to the playground. All the trees in front of school were trimmed, and any diseased or insect damaged trees were removed.



Security & Technology

Other facility improvements included upgrades to our security system with the addition of a new camera facing the parking lot and updated state of the art software. A new computer server was installed in the electrical component room, and Siemer Heating and Air Conditioning installed a new air conditioning unit in there as well to protect our new server from damaging heat.

Our ever growing preschool needs were met by furnishing the 5 day preschool classroom with new carpet, fresh paint and a new sink for washing all those little hands. We also re-carpeted a classroom and are making plans to replace the failing ice machine in the kitchen with a new one.

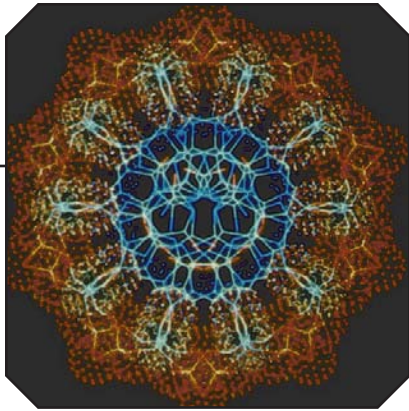
5-Year Plan

DESIGNED TO BEAR FRUIT..

Spiritual fruit-bearing is the ‘how to be’ of the heart-life which produces visible evidence in the ‘what to do’ of daily living. One of the most excellent descriptions of a life filled with fruit is Galatians 5:22-23. **“But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.”** The Spirit is at work continuously in our souls to produce this spiritual fruit.

This is the beautiful pattern of His design! God says in Hosea 14:8, “from me is your fruit found.” Our profession, our knowledge, and our outward works cannot produce this fruit. Desiring fruit and finding fruit are the results of His Grace from start to finish. As you bear witness to God’s work in the hearts of our children, rejoice! Christian Education is no less than God’s design to nurture the fruit bearing process in the children of believers. Here are a few snapshots into this work.

Not too long ago I met a particular 1st grade student in the hall. Her father was gravely ill. I asked her, “How is your dad doing? Did you get to visit him?” She beamed up at me with smiling eyes and a peaceful face, saying, “He is very sick. We are praying for him to get better, but Jesus might come to get him soon.” At her words, my tears welled. “Its o.k.,” she said, “I’ll be sad, but it will be better for him if he goes to Jesus.” Quiet words slipped from my lips, “You are a faithful little girl and today you taught me something.” And she skipped off. Peace, joy, love, and long-suffering!

Another beautiful pattern was made evident through the “less than tranquil” circumstance of discipline. What started as the opposite of self-control, goodness, and kindness ended beautifully as a result of disciplined discipleship. The Holy Spirit was faithful to renew this heart and dramatically change a life! On the first day of 2011, I heard a quick knock on my door. As I turned around, there appeared a smiling face. We shared a few summer stories before I said, “Guess what? You did a great job last year and have a fresh start.” He hugged me and ran off to meet his classmates. On the Monday after my grandson was born this student walked in my office and said, “I’m happy your grandson was born on the day of Grace (meaning Sunday).” Gentleness, kindness and self-control!

Not all (or even most) of the fruit we see comes out of discipline or hardship. One student has stopped by the office two or three times every week since August 2010 just to say, ‘have a good day’ or ‘how can I pray for you’. Goodness and faithfulness. The great privilege of working in Christian Education is to see and hear about fruit-bearing many times every single day. Our teachers could tell many more stories!



It is an amazing, incredible opportunity to be part of the daily re-formatational work God is doing among us. We pray that each of you will be encouraged and uplifted by these few stories. Jesus Christ is uniting Himself to the children of believers at Highland Christian School; of this we have no doubt! This is the work of a faithful covenant-keeping God where believers seek (by Grace), the means He has designed for bearing spiritual fruit! **Soli Deo Gloria. Only for God’s Glory!**

The Foundation has many reasons to give thanks. The Barnabas Foundation's guidance through these challenging times has given us a healthy principle upon which to build. We are extremely grateful to our constituency for their prayerful support of this worthwhile cause.

Annual Gifts

How It All Started

etc... a resale marketplace was created by the Highland Christian School Foundation in 2009. It was designed to be an investment of the Foundation with the goal of generating long-term profits. By reinvesting such profits in the Foundation Fund we would be able to increase our asset base, and continue the direct tuition credit we currently give to each student.

HCS Resale Shop's Unique Purpose Compared to Other Schools

It is important to note that this setup is unique to Highland Christian School (HCS) compared to other schools in the area. We have received feedback from HCS families that other resale stores make gifts directly to the schools to be applied to students' tuition. While this is true at several area schools, it is important to note that these schools do not have a Foundation the size of HCS Foundation that has for many years made an annual gift that is used as a credit against tuition. ETC should be viewed as an operating enterprise of the Foundation that in the long-term will grow the Foundation assets and thus the annual gift to the school and the tuition credit.

An Immediate Benefit

All families have already received benefits from ETC. For the 2011-2012 school year, a portion of the profits from ETC were used to help fund the annual tuition gift of \$356 per student. This was done to maintain the gift level from the 2010-2011 school year. The annual gift from the Foundation to the school is calculated based on a rolling asset value over three years. The market downturn in 2008 actually caused a reduction in the asset base in the Foundation and would have resulted in a reduced gift of almost \$100 per student. Rather than allow this to occur, the ETC Board and Foundation Board agreed to earmark over \$36,000 of the profits from the store to fund this shortfall.



Financial Results So Far

The store continues to perform well. The store opened in April of 2009 after an initial investment of \$129,000 by the Foundation. The store's fiscal year is from August 1-July 31. For the first partial fiscal year the store had sales of \$95,000 and a net loss of \$9,800. In the first full fiscal year ending July 31, 2010, the store had sales of \$379,000 and a net profit of \$91,000. For the past fiscal year that ended July 31, 2011, sales grew 16% to \$439,000 and net profits grew 17% to \$107,000. In the first 26 months since the store opened, it was able to repay the original \$129,000 invested by the Foundation and also make a gift of \$100,000, \$36,000 of which was used to maintain the Foundation's annual tuition gift for this current school year.

The store continues to grow its sales and profits which will be a benefit for all HCS families, both today and for years in the future. This accomplishment would not have been possible without the hard work of the staff and volunteers. A very special thanks and our gratitude is owed to Nancy Scheeringa, Johnna Otte, Lynea Lytle and Jessica Porte for their dedication and hard work in managing the store. We also want to thank the hundreds of volunteers who have given of their time in making this store the success that it is. There has been much sweat equity, tears and prayers invested in the store.

To succeed, the store continues to need your donations of gently used merchandise and a willing cadre of volunteers to serve in all areas of the store.
